Cucamonga Station is a multi-modal transportation hub in the heart of the Inland Empire that is driving an economic transformation in San Bernardino County and will elevate the region's foothold as a global connectivity point and destination to everything Southern California has to offer.

Cucamonga Station is at the epicenter of a transportation movement that will change how millions of individuals will connect through smart, sustainable travel.

TRANSPORTATION CONNECTIVITY AT CUCAMONGA STATION

Cucamonga Station will be the first multi-modal transportation hub in the U.S. to connect true high-speed passenger rail service via Brightline West's Las Vegas to Southern California line, connection to Metrolink's regional passenger train service and Omnitrans bus services – all connecting to Ontario International Airport (ONT) through existing shuttle service. A future planned underground tunnel transit service will connect Cucamonga Station directly to ONT terminals.
